

## Commitment to REACH compliance – Version 20 /06/ 2017

**REFERENCE:** European Regulation N<sup>o</sup> 1907/2006 dated December 18, 2006 REACH concerning the registration, evaluation, authorization and restriction of chemicals.

Dear Customer,

The REACH regulation has a significant impact on the availability of substances and preparations in the European market. We have anticipated the eventual changes of substances, in our articles in order to ensure uninterrupted supply.

According to this regulation, we are considered as a downstream user and an article supplier. We do not produce, nor import, any substance ourselves and our articles are not made to reject substances in normal conditions of use. Therefore, we do not have to pre-register nor register substances included in our articles. We work actively to ensure that all of our suppliers complied and comply with our obligations.

1. We comply with Annex XVII on Restrictions of use of certain substances, updated 15 February 2017. In accordance with the restriction 52, our products are not intended to be used as toys or childcare articles (any product intended to facilitate sleep, relaxation, hygiene, the feeding of children or sucking on the part of children) that can be put in contact with mouths by children. (For the purpose of this paragraph, it is considered that an article or accessible part of an article may be placed in the mouth by children if it is smaller than 5 cm in one dimension or has a detachable or protruding part of that size. Then article can be brought to the mouth and kept in the mouth by children so that it can be sucked and chewed. If the object can just be licked, it can be regarded as “placed in the mouth”).

2. According to the version of 16 June 2017 Annex XIV, entitled: “List of substances submitted to an authorization process” by the European Chemicals Agency, we inform you that none of the substances mentioned are present in our articles of more than 0.1 % by mass.

3. A “Candidate List of Substances of Very High Concern for Authorisation” (SVHC), candidate substance for inclusion in Annex XIV, was updated 12 of January 2017. We would like to inform you that our products do not contain any substance mentioned in this list of more than 0.1% by mass.
